In 2002 I took up a Wellcome Trust research fellowship alongside a consultant nephrologist position at Guy's and St Thomas' NHS trust. In 2008 I was appointed Senior Lecturer and in 2018 Reader in Nephrology (King's College London).

I undertake laboratory-based and clinical research in immune-mediated kidney disease. I also have a research interest in vascular access for haemodialysis and led a UK wide clinical trial (PAVE trial).

I am the lead nephrologist in a large clinic for patients with lupus and vasculitis having established this clinic more than 10 years ago.
